Hours of Operation

Golf Course

The golf course is fully open with riding carts available in the spring, summer, and fall, weather permitting. During the winter months, the greens are closed for play and no carts are available to rent; temporary pins are placed in the fairways allowing members to walk and get some swings in during the off-season. There will be tournaments and maintenance practices that interrupt our normal schedule, all of which will be listed on the tee sheet prior to the reservation window opening, but the following times will be the First Tee Time on a normal week. Please note that the clubhouse and golf course are closed on Mondays for limited outside events and golf course maintenance.

Practice Facilities

The driving range will open half an hour before the first tee time; and close 60 minutes before sunset, with the exception of Sunday evenings when it will close three hours before sunset to allow staff the opportunity to “clean pick” the landing area. The driving range will be set on the mats only in March and November to allow the grass tee time to grow.

Tee Time Booking Policies

NorthStar Golf Club utilizes a tee time reservation system to organize golfers for play. Members may book a tee time up to 7 days in advance through our club website, or by calling the golf shop. The online reservation system is scheduled to begin accepting tee times each day at 6:00 am one week prior. Guests are only permitted to golf 6 rounds per season.

The tee time reservation system allows anonymous players to be added to a member's group at the time of booking. Members will be contacted two days in advance and expected to update player information prior to play.

Tournament Registration

The member tournament program is a source of pride for both our membership and staff. The events detailed in this booklet are available for sign up online through Golf Genius or by calling the golf shop. Event registration opens on March 19, 2024 at 7:00 am for our earliest events and then each later event will open two months in advance.

Bag Drop

When arriving at NorthStar Golf Club, please utilize the bag drop located to the left of the clubhouse where a player assistant will be located to set up your bag in the golf cart staging area. When finishing your round, please return your golf cart to the golf cart return area on the south end of the building so that a player assistant can clean your clubs and store them properly or prepare the bag for departure. Our player assistants are here to assist you; NorthStar club policy allows members and guests to show their appreciation for their assistance by tipping. \$2-\$5 is a suggested tip amount for a job well done.

Hole-In-One Club

The Hole-In-One Club is designed to award individuals who have been fortunate to experience one of golf's greatest thrills. The Hole-In-One Fund is established by charging each Golf Membership a \$3 fee each time an adult Golf Member makes a hole-in-one.

Participation in the Hole-in-One Club is mandatory for golf memberships, so there is no registration required. Each hole-in-one by a Golf Member will trigger a \$3 charge to each golf membership account. The money raised by the Hole-in-One Club fees will be used by the member who made the Hole-in-One to first cover their expenses at the bar. A Hole-in-One should be properly celebrated with a round of drinks at the discretion of the golfer who made the shot, and the Hole-in-One Fund is designed to act as insurance to cover most of the expense. In the event there are leftover funds after the bar tab, the golfer who made the Hole-in-One will be awarded the remainder as Pro Shop Credit.

Supporting Mobile Apps

NorthStar Golf Club utilizes a number of golf-related mobile apps that help our members better interact with the golf department. The following apps allow players to book tee times, track their games, and interact with our tournament program.

NorthStar – Our club’s app is used for the booking of tee times and simulator times as well as other member services such as payment of your monthly bill and receiving of alerts regarding daily golf bulletins (daily cart rules, range conditions, event announcements). Each member needs to “Sign Up” for a NorthStar app account the first time they use it.

GHIN – The Golf Handicap & Information Network (GHIN) is a service offered by the USGA to golf associations worldwide. GHIN is one of the largest handicap management tools in the world, serving more than 2 million golfers and 15,000 golf clubs. This application is used by golfers to post scores and maintain a handicap index which is required to participate in most events at NorthStar Golf Club. In addition to posting scores, the app also allows users to track various playing stats. If you would like to create a new GHIN account or transfer one from a different club, a member of the NorthStar Golf Professional staff can assist you.

Cap Patrol – This app is used in conjunction with GHIN to help ensure golfers are posting rounds in a timely manner, tracking their individual performance and assisting our handicap committee with peer review of golfer handicaps at our club. After downloading the app you will be asked to create a username and password and will be required to enter your GHIN number to gain access to the app.

Golf Genius – Golf Genius is the tournament software that is used to run all golf events at NorthStar Golf Club, this includes registration and scoring of events. Individuals can view the full event directory through the mobile app or website by using the Golf Genius ID or GGID: NORTHSTARGOLF2025 when logging in, but Golf Genius will only allow individuals to register for events through the website (www.golfgenius.com). Golf Genius also allows for live mobile scoring through the app. During an event you will be provided with a unique GGID on your scorecard which will allow you to keep score on your mobile device as well view the leaderboard of an event in real time.

Instruction and Golf Club Fitting

NorthStar Golf Club features a great practice facility with putting and short game areas as well as a large driving range complete with an artificial turf hitting option for wet conditions. Our professional staff is readily available to help you with your game with various clinics throughout the season as well as one-on-one instruction to improve your full-swing, short game, and on-course scoring abilities. PRIVATE LESSONS

Private lessons, at the request of the student, may focus on the full swing, short game, or putting. Playing lessons, focusing on golf course management, are also available with an advance tee time. All swing lessons include expert advice, TrackMan swing data analysis, and a voiced-over video recording that summarizes the lesson. Your first private lesson will start with an approximate 15 minute conversation and initial swing analysis. This is when your goals are communicated and an initial improvement plan is developed.

JUNIOR ACADEMY OVERVIEW

Rising Stars: Designed for junior golfers ages 9-12, or in Middle School

Ryder Cup and Solheim Cup Points Structure

The Ryder Cup and Solheim Cup are intraclub team competitions at the end of the golf season to reward top finishers and those that support our member tournament calendar throughout the golf season. The top 34 men (plus two captains' selections) from the Ryder Cup Standings and the top 12 women from the Solheim Cup Standings will be invited to compete in their respective competition. Ryder Cup and Solheim Cup points will be awarded to participants in member events broken into three categories: Major Events, Minor Events, and Participation Events.

Major Event Points Structure

Each participant will receive 20 participation points and have the opportunity to earn bonus points based on their performance. The "Performance Bonus Point Pool" will consist of 100 points per player, to be distributed among approximately the top 60% of finishers within each flight. For example, an eight-person flight would award 800 total points among the top five finishers, with the flight winner receiving the most points and the next four finishers receiving a decreasing number of points.

Minor Event Points Structure

Each participant will receive 10 participation points and have the opportunity to earn bonus points based on their performance. The "Performance Bonus Point Pool" will consist of 50 points per player, to be distributed among approximately the top 60% of finishers within each flight. For example, an eight-person flight would award 400 total points among the top five

finishers, with the flight winner receiving the most points and the next four finishers receiving a decreasing number of points.

Participation Events

Participation events prioritize camaraderie over performance and therefore do not offer any bonus points for performance

The current standings for the Ryder Cup and Solheim Cup may be found on Golf Genius under the member tournament registration page throughout the season.

Note: The Ryder Cup points per major and minor event will be based on actual participation numbers for the 2025 events. Points per place will be determined on the first day of play. Conversely, the Solheim Cup points per major and minor events will be based on past participation records allowing for point totals to be placed in this booklet.

Handicapping Policies and Procedures

The Handicap Committee of the NorthStar Golf Club serves in an advisory role to the Head Golf Professional for ensuring compliance with the obligations under the World Handicap System in accordance with the Rules of Handicapping and the USGA. The Handicap Committee will verify that acceptable scores are posted for handicap purposes and made available for peer review. The Handicap Committee will perform score audits and review members' scoring records at least annually and prior to the first Major event as established by the Tournament Committee and within compliance of the Tournament Eligibility Rules.

In addition, the Handicap Committee provides guidance to the NorthStar Golf Club golf professionals and other club Committees to ensure players consistently have the ability to use their Handicap Index to compete, or play a recreational round, with anyone else on a fair and equitable basis. Key Committees include the NorthStar Golf Club Golf Committee and the Competition Committee.

The Handicap Committee consults with the Competition Committee to establish the Terms of the Competition for all applicable events at the club. The Handicap Committee cooperates with the Golf Committee in maintaining both length and normal playing difficulty of the course at a constant and fair level.

The Handicap Committee consists of an appointed Chair and Co-chair per the Golf Committee charter and are serving members of the Golf Committee. Both Handicap Committee members must have a strong history of maintaining a personal handicap and have passed the USGA Handicapping certification.

The Handicap Committee has set forth the following policies and procedures for all members wishing to establish and maintain a Handicap Index with our club.

- Maintain an active membership on the handicap roster of the club.
- Post all acceptable scores, including 9-hole rounds.

Handicapping Policies and Procedures (Continued)

- Scores are to be posted within the same day of the round being played.
- Where applicable, proper adjustments must be applied to all scores for posting purposes, including net double bogey and most likely score (Rule 3.3)
- Each player will try to make the best score at every hole in every round, regardless of where the round is played.
- Providing education (Online or hardcopy literature) regarding how to establish and maintain a proper handicap
- Auditing NorthStar Golf Club member compliance with USGA handicapping rules and the Golf Committees established tournament play eligibility rules.

What is an Acceptable Score?

- For an 18-hole score to be acceptable for handicap purposes, a minimum of 10 holes must be played. Please note: players must post hole-by-hole scores for 10-17 hole scores to be converted to an 18-hole score.
- For a 9-hole score to be acceptable for handicap purposes, all 9 holes must be played.
- Scores made in match play, stroke play and team competitions
- Scores made under Rule 3.2 when a hole is not played
- Scores made under Rule 3.3 when a player does not hole out
- Scores made if a player is disqualified from a competition but has an acceptable score
- Scores made when played by the Rules of Golf
- Scores made when played on a course during its active season
- Scores made in the company of at least one other person with an established / verified handicap, who can also act as a marker

All acceptable scores are to be posted within the same day of play using one of the following methods: The following statements are examples you might consider at your club's discretion.

- GHIN Mobile app
- Returned to the golf shop/Handicap Committee for posting
- By the Competitions Committee using tournament software
- Golf Genius (during sanctioned play)

Disciplinary Actions for failure to post or player manipulating their Handicap Index

First failure to post or potential manipulation of your score will result in a verbal warning.

Second failure will result in a written warning served via email.

Third failure will result in the appropriate penalty score issued for scores not posted.

After your fourth failure to post your score or continued manipulation of the scoring record, further disciplinary action will be taken as the Handicap Chair and Committee deems fair and equitable. This can include but is not limited to exclusion of NorthStar Golf Club sanctioned golf events.

A player must earn a Handicap Index. No player has an inherent right to a Handicap Index without demonstrating ability to our Golf Club's Handicap Committee. The Handicap Committee has the authority and obligation to adjust a Handicap Index if it feels necessary to do so.

Tournament Eligibility and Rules

To be eligible for the major golf tournaments certain conditions must be met:

Eligibility Criteria and Exceptions:

- All players must have a GHIN and record a minimum of five (5) rounds of witnessed golf at NorthStar for that playing year.
- If the above condition is not met one (1) week prior to the event, the second eligibility criteria is five (5) posted NorthStar tournament scores from the previous playing year.
- Must be full golf member or an affiliate member
- Player(s) deemed ineligible will be reviewed by the Tournament, Handicap Committee, and Head Golf Professional. Based on review of player data or other available information the Head Golf Professional reserves the right to permit participation with a full allowable index or may choose to reduce the players index as needed to preserve the level of competition.

Tournament Rules and Areas of Focus:

- USGA Rules apply to all tournament play.
- If a Tournament Official is not available for a ruling, play a second ball and record both scores.
- Before submitting your Scorecard, see the Head Golf Professional and discuss the situation in accordance with Rule 3-3b.

Men's Tees: Championship Division in the Men's Stroke Play Championship will play from the Black tees, all other competitions will play from the designated tee box, typically the blue/green (combo) and white tees. Players who desire to play a tee that is undesignated for a tournament are subject to review by the handicap committee and Head Golf Professional.

Eligibility to Move Up Tee Markers: The main tee used in the majority of Men's Golf Events is the Blue/Green Combo Tee. To have the option to move forward to the white tee or any further forward tees, the player will have to meet or exceed 60 as a combination of their age plus handicap index.

Eligibility to Move Back Tee Markers: Players may elect to play from the black tee markers if they carry a handicap index of 2.0 or better.

Tee Selection Note: Players are not permitted to mix tee selections to gain a competitive handicap advantage for an individual event. Players must designate a tee for the entire season.

Out of bounds and penalty areas:

- Staked Trees: One club length relief no nearer the hole complete relief from the tree, no penalty.
- Heather: all heather if not staked or painted shall be played as a red penalty area with a one stroke penalty, two club lengths of relief, no closer to the hole.
- Out of Bounds is defined by white stakes/lines.
- Penalty Areas are defined by red stakes/lines.
- If a ball is out of bounds, a player may re-tee or as an alternative to stroke-and-distance penalty, a player may drop a ball within two club-lengths, but not nearer the hole of the nearest edge of the fairway at an equal distance from the hole to where the ball was believed to have gone out of bounds and add two penalty strokes. This rule may not be used: 1) if a provisional ball is in play, or 2) for a ball in a penalty area, or 3) for an unplayable ball.

Tournament Eligibility and Rules (Continued)

14 clubs: Players are allowed to play with a maximum of 14 clubs. If there is an extra club in a player's bag, the player must notify his/her playing group of the club(s) he/she will not use during that round prior to starting the round.

Lost Ball: The maximum allotted time to search for a lost ball is 3 minutes.

Distance Measuring Devices: A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. However, if, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his/her play (e.g., gradient, wind-speed, temperature, etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification - regardless of whether any such additional functions are used.

Pace of Play: scorecards have EXPECTED time to complete the play of each hole based on a group's scheduled starting time printed on the card itself. These times are established based on the difficulty of the course and the ability of the field. They include time to search for lost balls and deal with other common occurrences encountered during play. A normal speed of play should result in completing play in the time indicated on the scorecard. If a group falls behind, they must play efficient golf and make up the lost time. This might mean playing ready golf or continuous putting, which are both permitted in stroke play. It is the PLAYERS' RESPONSIBILITY to know their group's position relative to the published Pace of Play and to ensure they play within the published limits. Failure to play within the Pace of Play guidelines will result in a penalty of two strokes. The head golf professional or designee may communicate with groups throughout the stipulated round regarding their pace of play position but are not required to do so.

The Lead Group is expected to finish their round within 15 minutes of the listed time on the scorecard. If they finish over that time each player will receive a penalty of two strokes to their score for the final hole. The following groups are expected to finish within 15 minutes of the group in front of them. Failure to do so will result in a penalty of two strokes, which will be added to their score on the final hole.

Handicap: The head golf professional is responsible for establishing the handicap as it applies to tournaments. In certain events playing handicap may be reduced, however the maximum handicap index will be set at 40.0 for women and 36.0 for men.

Scoring:

- The Rules Committee reserves the right to review all penalty situations during end-of-round scoring procedures. At the completion of the round, all participants in the pairing group are required to report to the designated scoring area.
- Any questions or concerns regarding a score, ruling etc. must be reported at that time. The Head Golf Professional and Tournament Committee will make a final judgment after an investigation is completed.
- Playoff format will be at the discretion of the head golf professional. Tiebreaking formats will be listed in the rules format for each individual event.
- If utilizing Golf Genius (electronic scoring) all scores are final 30 minutes after the completion of the round.

Disqualification and Rules Enforcement: The Head Golf Professional along with the guidance from the tournament committee have the right to govern and assess the tournament rules up to and including tournament disqualification.

Member-Run Weekend Pot Games

Saturdays & Sundays (Excluding Conflicting Member Event Dates)

Dates: Year-Round, weather permitting

Entry Fee: \$20 Cash includes Prize Fund, Skins, and One Drink after Golf

There are two separate member-run “Pot Games” on Saturday & Sunday mornings

The first game each morning is a “Tournament” Style Game - No Gimmies, No Breakfast ball, and 50% of your index.

The second game is intended to be more social and is deemed the “Traditional” Style Game- 3’ Gimmies, Breakfast Ball, 100% of your index.

Both games are \$20 Cash after play, collected in the Clubhouse.

Game styles change, but skins and scores are entered and calculated through the same live scoring app that NorthStar’s professional staff uses for tournaments - Golf Genius.
